## *The President's Column!*

The last round saw some very encouraging performances for the club, however the weather robbed us of at least three wins.

There was some great batting performances particularly in the firsts. Conversely after watching several batsmen come and go in very quick succession, I would say that a number of us need to address our mental approach to the game. Cricket is probably 40% psychological, having the right approach is critical. If you're struggling to get runs talk to one of the clubs batsman, listen and take up the advice. Compiling runs is all about intent, concentration and determination.

The weather also put all our facilities to the test. It was pleasing to see that the recently completed drainage works has had a significant effect on surface water on the synthetic turf. Now after heavy rain there may be pooling at the bowlers end of the wicket which seems to drain within a day, previously the wicket and bowlers end was flooded. Slightly changes to the soil level between the wicket end and the bowling area will be made to enhance drainage. In addition the surrounds have been raked to remove excess scoria and further works are planned to rake the soil and level the surrounds.

In other news on facility development Buildings and Grounds visited the Jarvis area to review the planned oval extension. The intentions are for the oval to be extended to the west and south to enable soccer to play their matches between our turf wicket and the clubrooms. This will result in the oval fronting the clubrooms with alternate arrangement having to be made for the road, for parking and for access to our shed. This will make a huge difference to our operations and is a very welcomed development.

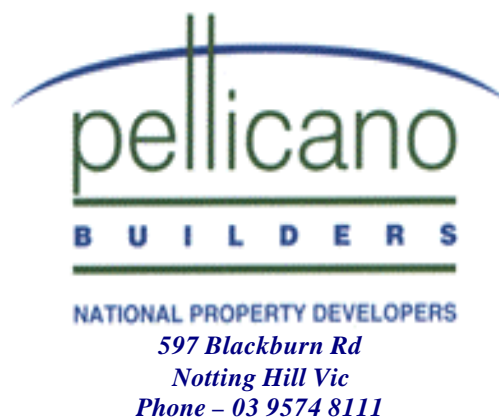

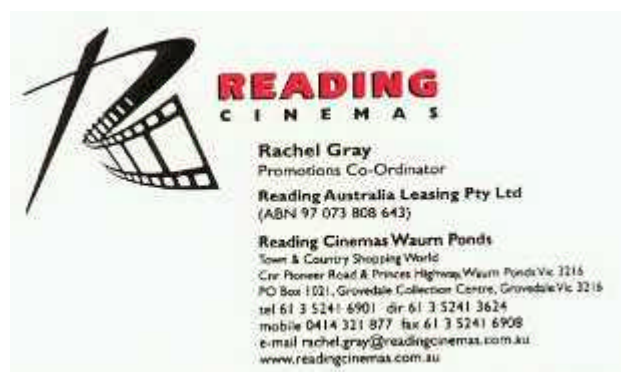

## Second XI Report V Nth Shore

This Saturday Sunday match appeared to be a nightmare fixture with concerns about player availability and fitness. Happily we were able to select a full squad and better still they were all in attendance on arrival at Windsor Park. For those who may be unaware Windsor Park was the location of my first ever football match as an under 11 junior. I recall my dad screaming from the sidelines to get in and lay a tackle. ## Day One.

After some canny selection skills by Chris Hindle we again lined up with a totally new third eleven. Garth Boyd was recruited out of the Ponds by Billy, and Frank and Mat (Kenners junior) came up from the juniors. While Rocket, Steve and Shane were promoted to the twos.

University won the toss and elected to bat. Stuart and Chris opened with Chris showing a lot of promise as an opening bat (a la Rohan Boyd), after a well made six runs Chris departed and Crumpets (Clinton Mayes) was elevated up the order, two balls later this decision was questioned. Pat came out and batted defensively (not) for nine and then Luke and Jess arrived (at the ground), Luke came and batted with the skipper until Stu (23) tried to leg glance a ball outside off. Jess and Luke had a good partnership despite Luke's silly hat. Jess contained himself and hit ten off the last over before lunch. Importantly getting a score over 100 gave the bowlers a target to aim for.

While Luke bowled accurately controlling his line and length to the free swinging North Shore wood cutters. Luke (10/1/4/33) took four wickets, two bowled and two caught behind and also made our first run out for the year. 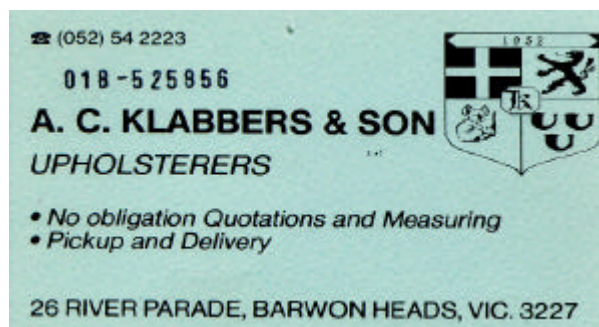

## **Keep fit over the Christmas break!**

### **Stretching**

Calf Muscles - Lean against wall one foot in front of other - push, hold 15-30 seconds. Then do the same with the other leg.

Quadriceps - Standing, raise your heel to your back side, hold with hand from 15-20 seconds.

Hamstrings - Standing, raise your heel on a chair/fence, and hold that position. Reach and touch toe, then hold.

Sit on floor - reach for toes slowly - feet 5 inches apart.

Lie on back - lift leg vertical with sole parallel to floor - up as far you can.

Groin Stretch - Sit on floor, with soles together then push knees out gradually.

Abdominal - Lie on back with hands behind head, raise your legs off the floor and push them out alternately as far as you can, almost touching the floor. Do this slowly, keeping your toes pointed. Build up to 50 or 60.

Lie on back with hands behind your head and heels near back side; sit up and touch knees with elbow. (3 X 10)

Same position, left elbow to right knee, right elbow to left knee. (3 X 10).

Back - Lie on stomach, keep hips on floor, raise shoulders and hold for 10 seconds, then down. Repeat. After this exercise lie on your back, bring your knees up to your chest and hold for 10 seconds.

Push ups, keep your body straight during the push ups. Do 10 then have 15 seconds rest, then another 10 building up to 3 sets of 10.

Lateral Stretches - Standing, place your right hand behind your head, run your left hand down your left side keeping your elbow and leg straight. Repeat with the right hand.

Quad. Strengthening - Standing, place hands on hips, bend knees and go down half way, hold for 5 seconds then up. Try to keep back straight. Build up to 3 sets of 10. (Good for wicket keepers and slips fieldsmen).

### **Running for Fitness**

The running activities in cricket are generally sprint - rest, sprint - rest eg. running between wickets, fielding and bowling run up, and the best preparation for this is through wind sprints and/or interval training.

Interval Training - Run 100 metres, walk back, run 100 metres - build up to 10 runs and build up speed from "slow", in initial sessions to "full speed" in later sessions. Run 200 metres as above - build up to 6 runs

Run 200 metres, jog, run 100 metres, jog, run 50 metres, jog.

Add 300 metres to the above sequence.

Wind Sprinting - Run the straights and walk the curves of the oval. (Making two straights and two curves in each lap) Make the straights about 90 metres long. Gradually build up speed during the straights till you hit top speed near the end. Build up strength till you can run 4 to 6 laps.

Put two stumps 20 metres (30 or 40) apart - build up speed and hit top pace at the first stump then hold it till the second stump then slow down. Turn round and repeat the run in the reverse direction. Build up to 8 runs. (This can be done wearing pads, later!)

Run round the boundary - build up to top speed, hold for 40 metres, slow down - then build up speed again and repeat for two or three laps.

You should select a program of running from the interval training and/or wind sprints which suits your current level of fitness, to be carried out during the pre season. I would be happy to discuss this with you if you require assistance. You will probably have to set aside some time, other than the scheduled training nights at this stage of the season in order to gain the required level of fitness. You can train alone or form a group for these extra sessions.

Again a word of caution; if you have not done a great deal of running etc for some time, move into this program gradually and enjoy the feeling of well being which comes from improving fitness.
