## COUPLES

Justin, 35, and Nicole Aisha Kristiansen, 34, live in Avalon. Both teachers, they have been married for 18 months. The birth of their triplets, Sara, Jakob and Hannah, on February 19 coincided with the 10-year anniversary of their relationship. Justin and Aisha are both at home looking after the babies full-time while Justin is on long service leave.

**Aisha** – A good thing about having triplets is we don't need to stagger it out. I wanted two and Justin wanted three and so we would have been closing on 40 when we'd had our family, whereas I'm 34, done and dusted.

**Justin** – We're the last of our friendship group to get married and the last of our group to have kids. We can now say we're the first to finish our family.

**Justin** – Even once we got married and we had said we want to have kids you still run through the gamut – is it going to happen? We have one set of friends, first month they tried, they got pregnant. Another set of friends who've had great difficulty. We feel blessed we've had three; we'd feel blessed if we had one.

**Aisha** – I had gone off the pill in preparation, knowing that after we got married we would be wanting to start a family. When I didn't get pregnant I went to the doctor and found out I had a very mild issue with my ovaries – polycystic ovarian syndrome – and he was heartless in how he described it. I called Justin and was hysterical. I went to a specialist who said it was very mild and put me on a weak dose of an ovulation tablet; the normal starting dose is one but they started me off on half. He said come back if you're not pregnant in three months. We were pregnant the first month.

**Justin** – This is the thing when you decide to get pregnant it adds the pressure, the weight of it is on your relationship. There are difficulties, every month Aisha is looking for this, looking for that, this is the time – lets go for it. It adds pressure on your relationship you wish wasn't there. I said we've got three months, let's not put the pressure on, let's not worry. I don't want you to test. Aisha used to get up 5.30 in the morning to drive to work, I'm in bed asleep, and then I hear this almighty scream – we're pregnant.

**Aisha** – We made the appointment for eight weeks and he said oh, we're having twins. Then there was another oh and he said there was a possibility of another.

**Justin** – The drive home was so surreal. It was very quiet in the car; we were going through a gamut of emotions. It was fantastic but it was also hang on – is this too much for us, what are the risks in the pregnancy, what does this mean for our lives? All these things are going through our minds. We then go a few days later for a further ultrasound.

**Aisha** – We found out we were having triplets. I had ultrasounds, two weekly, but I had a problem free pregnancy; no blood pressure, no back pain, no veins, nothing other than a little bit of heart burn. I'm very positive about everything in my life and it was only the day before they were born I was getting nervous.

**Justin** – I've never had a relationship last over three months and I suppose after six months with Aisha I know we'd be together. You ride the love roller coaster, have the ups and downs. I was 25 when we met, we weren't in a rush.

**Aisha** – I'll tell you how we met – on orientation at uni I turned up at the lecture and he was asked to speak on behalf of the faculty. I went off thinking 'wow, this guy is unbelievable'. He's quite magical when he speaks, I was utterly impressed. I went away thinking I wouldn't see him again.

**Justin** – After that speech, I walked past her in the corridor and I thought 'wow, look at those supermodel looks' and she smiled at me and I thought she was just being nice because I had spoken. I knew she was out of my league.

**Aisha** – Next day you had to sign up for the different clubs. He was sitting on the education club and I walked close to the table and he said to me – you were in that lecture yesterday, come over and sign up – and three hours later he had given me his phone number.

**Justin** – I wouldn't have been that brash and open if I thought I had any chance with her. After three hours I didn't have the courage to ask for her number so I gave her mine, just in case. I didn't want the rejection of asking for hers.

**Aisha** – I took a week to phone, you know you want to call but at the same time be a bit guarded and you don't

want to be too keen. We had lots of romantic evenings where I was completely mesmerised by him.

**Justin** – I'm not sure if courtships are like this anymore. I was very innocent. We spent a lot of time talking by the beach. I feel blessed she appreciated my intelligence, it's about the only thing going for me, I'm not a stunner. I was in the second year of my post grad. I started teaching the next year and Aisha was still at uni.

**Aisha** – Marriage was something we definitely wanted. It's part of being proud to be together.

**Justin** – If it had turned out we couldn't have had a family I can truly tell you I would have been happy just to be with Aisha for the rest of my life. I don't mean that to sound corny. We did get married to have kids, but also to show the world we are going to be together for evermore.

**Aisha** – Because we had some friends who had had difficulties getting pregnant we had thought about it (marriage) and knew it wasn't just about having a family.

**Justin** – I'm an only child of a single mother and Aisha is a fraternal twin with twins running strongly in her family but we have a lot of commonality in what we believe in.

**Aisha** – There is pressure – people say when are you getting engaged, then when are you getting married, then when are you having a family?

**Justin** – Now the questions have stopped anyway.

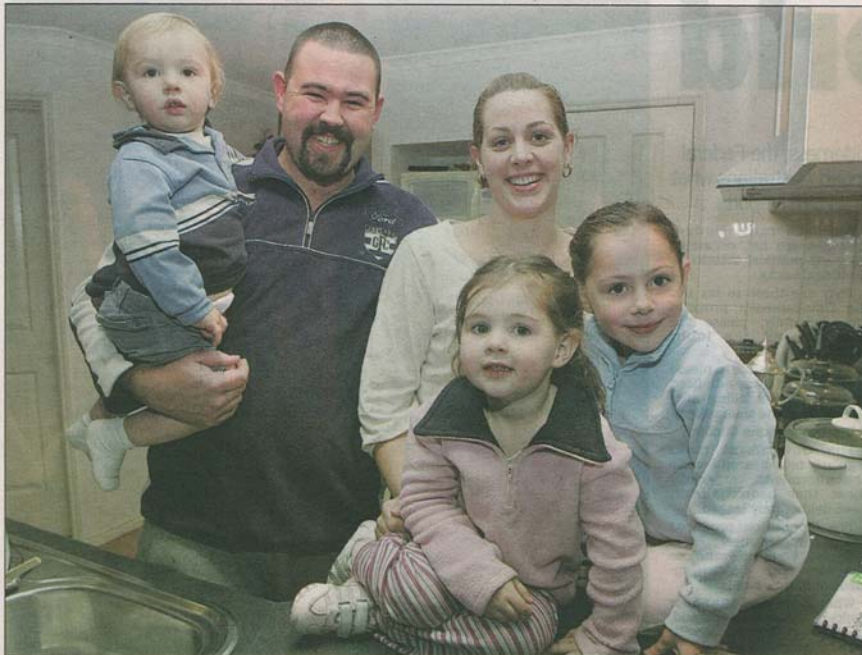

## Working families get small tax cuts

THERE might have been a change of government, but Waurn Ponds couple Shane and Jenny Skene feel there's been little respite for average working families like their own.

Their family will receive a weekly tax cut of about \$20 a week from Federal Treasurer Wayne Swan's first Budget.

But they, like many others, will continue to feel the pinch of rising interest rates and high government taxes on petrol.

Mr Skene, who works as a plasterer, and Mrs Skene, who sells Tupperware in her spare time, have a \$250,000 mortgage on their Shiraz Drive home.

They also have three children; Chloe, 5, Emily, 3, and Ethan, 19 months, to care for.

The couple earn about \$1200 a week between them, which means cuts to the Medicare levy do not affect them.

As they don't require childcare, they won't benefit from the improved rebates announced last night.

Interest rate rises have pushed their home loan repayments up to \$420 a week, while at least \$80 goes on fuel.

Mrs Skene said she was pleased the Government had hit the rich with measures, such as tax slugs on luxury vehicles, in a bid to cut inflation but believed the minor tax cuts were pointless.

"I reckon that it's fantastic that they've targeted the rich, because we're not the ones who are driving inflation up."

"It's all the rich people who can buy whatever they want that push it up," she said.

"I think tax cuts are pretty

useless overall because they give it in one hand and take it away with the other. More support for families is good, but it shouldn't be (for) just your two working parents.

"It doesn't make any sense for me to go and get a proper job, because I have to put kids into daycare and that can be expensive, so there's no incentive."

Mr Skene equated last night's tax cut to a six pack of beer, but his wife said his intake of his beloved Carlton Dry would soon dry up if interest rates continued to climb.

"We're not really in any big financial pressure but our mortgage since we started has gone up by close to \$80 a week," she said.

"We've got a budget and we stick to it pretty strictly and (if it went up) you'd just cope because you have to. I'm not losing my house. Shane just doesn't get his beer."

# In case you had forgotten..



**I**F ever the fine line between pleasure and pain was on display, it was on Sunday at Winter Reserve.

Division One's nail-biting grand final encapsulated the viewing of almost 1000 in attendance, mostly kept at bay by the rain.

But it was Grovedale's sector of the crowd that invaded the ground when Aaron Muncey knocked over South Barwon number 11 Phil Hunt to clinch an amazing four-run victory.

The Swans were denied their dream by two Tigers - Garry Kelson's rear-guard 87 in awful conditions for batting was nothing short of legendary, single-handedly propelling Grovedale to a competitive 126 in the overcast and wet conditions.

Despite losing opener Simon Breuer and first-drop Andrew Morrison prior to stumps, South was still in the box seat resuming at 2-25 the next day with its star middle-order still to bat.

However, a collapse, including the key dismissal of captain Brad Hauenstein for one, reduced the Swans to 7-56 and in desperate need of a big partnership from all-rounders

Anthony Ford (41) and Darren Hauenstein (28 not out).

The two experienced hitters played superbly to tick the total over to 103 before a miscued pull shot from Ford left a jubilant Grovedale two wickets away from a famous win.

After a tension-filled 15 minutes, fast bowler Brett Anderton hung tough with Hauenstein before coping with a howler of an lbw decision - the ball pitched outside leg stump and was inside-edged onto his pad - leaving the equation at 11 runs required with one wicket remaining.

Drawing on his experience of 10 grand finals in Warrambool, the brave Hunt held out the raw pace of Graeme Harper (6-37) long enough to offer the Swans a massive shot at victory - just six runs were required during a painstaking rain delay.

But after a Hauenstein single through cover, Muncey's accuracy prevailed, sparking inevitable scenes of emotional celebrations for the Tigers.

Fittingly, president Dean Oliver and scorer Fiona Minett were included in the team photo, the latter presented with a premiership medal for her outstanding support.

"It's entirely different to the first (Grovedale premiership in 2003-04) - a performance by two blokes got us over the line," Oliver said during team celebrations on Monday.

"Garry's innings was just sensational, and Harper, the poor bastard is a cripple (due to injuries)... to bowl like he did was unbelievable.

"After Christmas we were involved in three really close games and I think that stood us in good stead for the grand final."

In an after-match speech to the entire club in the South Barwon rooms on Sunday night, Hauenstein expressed his pride in the performance of his teammates and the manner in which they conducted themselves on the field.

The champion all-rounder emphasised he did not care about Ford's false shot or Hunt's decisive dismissal - rather that they were great people who could hold their heads up high after a fine season.

In Division Two, Waurn Ponds brought home its first title after smashing underdog Guild St Mary's by 139 runs at McDonalds Reserve in Highton.
